Doncaster Council offer a wide range of Social Care specific training

Can I get a replacement PA so I can support them to learn?

Can I get help with the costs?

There is funding available to help with the payments to back fill your care hours whilst they train Absolutely Yes, Your chosen organisation will help you find someone to support you whilst your PA trains.

How does this help me and my PA

It is important that your personal assistant has the training that they need, to be able to work for you.

This will make sure that they can be good at their job, work safely with you, and it will motivate them and develop their confidence.

If you have a care plan in place, you should think about what training your personal assistant needs to meet that plan. This should include any personal care responsibilities that they have.

Your personal assistant could do more formal training, where they can gain a qualification such as Diploma's.

Doncaster Council runs a Social Care Induction Programme which will gain the PA a certificate known as the "Care Certificate"



This will enable your PA to complete a full suite of mandatory Care related courses, to complete the Care Certificate. This is a 12 week programme where your PA will receive comprehensive face to face training in the first 6 weeks and Mentor support to complete the Care Certificate Workbook.

6 weeks of training covers the following courses

You can pick and mix the training your PA will complete to ensure they receive the relevant training for their role and your specific needs.
